Chapter 7: Naming Your Beagle

Naming your Beagle is **much more** important than you may think. The name you choose will decide **how well** your Beagle recognizes that name. This is a **huge** element in training your dog. **In addition**, if the name does not fit certain elements, other animals in the home **and** your Beagle may become very confused . . .

Chapter 14: Crating

If you properly train your dog to use the crate, he'll think of it as his safe place and will be happy to spend time there **when needed**. A crate is **not** a **magical method** in which you **simply** place your dog inside and they do **not** go to the bathroom. Your Beagle **will** need to urinate and eliminate whether or not they are inside of a crate.

Chapter 15: House Training an Older/ Senior Beagle

You may have gotten an **adult** Beagle for **many** reasons and your adult may have come from a breeder, rescue or other. In **some** cases, this adult Beagle will already be

house trained. *In other cases*, the dog *may* need to be *reminded*...or *may* need to learn from the beginning.

If your *adult* is *not* house trained, *ignore* the expression that “you can’t teach old dogs new tricks”...*because of course you can!*...

Chapter 18: All Puppy and Dog Food Elements

If you find that your Beagle is a picky or finicky eater, reinforcement training may be implemented. It is important to not give in to begging behavior. Your Beagle may simply not like the taste of the dog food that is being offered. You can try switching to a new brand; this is best done in *small* steps. This is *especially important* with young puppies, as a *fast* switch to a new food can cause health issues. Try blending in *a bit* more *each* week until you make the *final* switch. Adding a bit of plain chicken broth can also help make their meal more appealing. Your Beagle may *also* be a finicky eater if . . .

Chapter 28: Training Your Beagle to Heel (Walk Nicely Next to You)

Heeling is when your Beagle walks on your *left* with their head next to your left heel. Heeling *also* means when your dog follows along at *your* pace. When your Beagle is *fully* trained to heel, your dog will properly follow along whether you are walking, jogging or suddenly stop. A dog who heels always walks beside you and does not run ahead or stop to investigate everything. There will be plenty of times . . .

Chapter 31: Training Your Beagle to Stop Nipping (Biting at You)

Training your Beagle to not nip or bite at you is *best* done when the puppy is young. If not, it can become a hard habit for the Beagle to break. *However*, with these training secrets, even an older Beagle can be trained to stop nipping.

There are some elements to keep in mind *before* you begin training . . .
